



Johnny Warren Jamberoo Classic Sunday February 12 2012

Since 2003 over one thousand cyclists have tackled the challenging 96km route from Loftus to Jamberoo, raising over \$75,000 for the Sydney Cancer Centre Foundation and now, Chris O'Brien Lifehouse at RPA, where Johnny received his cancer treatment.

2012 sees the event become part of a weekend sporting festival. The Johnny Warren Memorial Cup 7s tournament takes place February 10-11, with the first ever women's 7s tournament combining to raise money for the Johnny Warren Football Foundation. A Brazilian theme will carry on throughout the weekend, creating an atmosphere that organisers hope will display the passion and culture that had such an impact on Johnny Warren's life.

ARE YOU THE MISSING LINK?

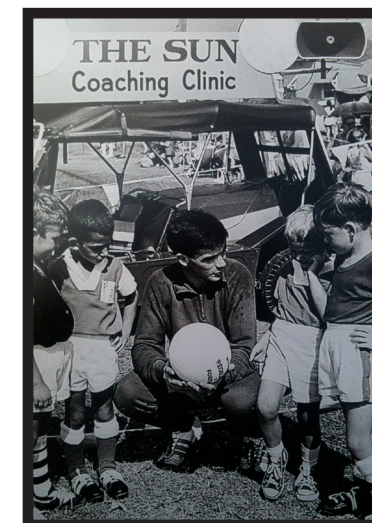
